

Oregon “Highly Qualified” Standards

- All teachers teaching in the core academic subjects below must meet highly qualified standards by the end of the 2005-2006 school year:
 - ✓ English
 - ✓ Reading/Language Arts
 - ✓ Mathematics
 - ✓ Foreign Languages
 - ✓ Civics & Government
 - ✓ Economics
 - ✓ Arts
 - ✓ History
 - ✓ Geography
 - ✓ Science
- All teachers hired after the first day of the 2002-2003 school year in programs supported by Title I funds and teaching in the core academic subjects must be highly qualified.
- Licenses that do **NOT** meet highly qualified status:
 - ✓ **ANY** Conditional Assignment Permit without passing PRAXIS test score in target core subject (still allowed under Oregon law but **ALL** misassignments must be reported each year)
 - ✓ Restricted Transitional License (**NOT** on an approved alternative route)
 - ✓ Expedited Service License (conditional until final approval)
 - ✓ Limited License
 - ✓ Any Substitute License
 - ✓ Teaching Associates License
 - ✓ American Indian Languages License
 - ✓ Provisional License
 - ✓ License of Accomplishment
 - ✓ Professional Technology License
 - ✓ Administrator License
 - ✓ Counseling License
 - ✓ School Psychologist License
 - ✓ CDS Certification
- Licenses that are automatically “highly qualified” **if** educator is properly assigned in any of the core academic subjects:
 - ✓ Basic Teaching License
 - ✓ Standard Teaching License
 - ✓ Initial I and Initial II Teaching License
 - ✓ Continuing Teaching License
 - ✓ Five-Year Elementary Teaching License
 - ✓ Five-Year Secondary Teaching License
- The Arts that are subject to NCLB requirements in Oregon are Music, Visual Arts & Drama
- The Foreign languages that are subject to NCLB requirements in Oregon are Spanish, French, German, Russian, Japanese and Latin
